# **Grand Saline ISD – 7th & 8th Grade Symphonic Band Syllabus**

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#### **Course Overview**

Symphonic Band is an advanced middle school ensemble for experienced student musicians. This course emphasizes high-level ensemble performance, advanced technical and musical skills, and the preparation of challenging repertoire for concerts, festivals, and contests. Students are expected to maintain a high level of personal responsibility, musicianship, and commitment to the group.

#### **Course Goals**

By the end of the year, students will:

- Perform advanced middle school concert band literature with precision and expression.
- Master major scales up to 4 sharps and 4 flats (minimum: 2 octaves where possible).
- Demonstrate accurate rhythm reading, including syncopation, mixed meter, and subdivision.
- Develop ensemble listening and balance skills.
- Prepare for and participate in UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Contest, Solo & Ensemble, and All-Region Band auditions.
- Demonstrate proper care, maintenance, and setup of their instrument at an advanced level.

### **Instructional Units**

#### August-September:

- Review and expand major scales and chromatic scale (full range of instrument).
- Advanced articulation styles (legato, staccato, accents, marcato).
- Tone development through long tones and lip slurs.
- Ensemble tuning and balance.
- First concert preparation.

#### October-December:

- Fall concert performance.
- All-Region audition music and technique drills.
- Rhythm mastery: dotted rhythms, syncopation, mixed meters.
- Increased tempo and technical demands in sight-reading.
- Begin UIL preparation.

#### January-March:

- UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Contest preparation.
- Emphasis on musical interpretation, phrasing, and dynamics.
- Continued technical drills: scale speed, range extension, and flexibility.

#### April-May:

- Solo & Ensemble preparation
- Spring concert and/or festival trip preparation.
- Community or special event performances.
- Year-end music reading projects.

## **Required Materials**

- **Instrument** (in excellent playing condition)
- Pencil (in band folder)
- Band binder with music in sheet protectors
- Required accessories (mutes, reeds, valve oil, swabs, etc.)

# **Grading Policy**

- Performances & Contests: 40%
- Playing Assessments & Chair Tests: 30%
- Written Quizzes & Theory Assignments: 15%
- Daily Participation & Preparedness: 15%

# **Practice Expectations**

Students should practice **30 minutes a day, 5 days a week**. Practice should focus on ensemble music, scales, and technical studies. Weekly assignments will be given and checked.

- Fall Concert October
- All-Region Band Auditions December
- Winter Concert December
- UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Contest March
- Solo & Ensemble Contest April(optional but encouraged)

- 3. Show respect to all students, directors, and equipment.
- 4. Follow rehearsal etiquette no talking during instructions or other sections' rehearsals.
