#### **Attendance Requirements**

In order to be successful in this class, it is important to be in class as much as possible. In the event situations arise that require you to miss, all assignments will be posted in Google Classroom for you to complete before returning to class. As listed in the student handbook, for each day a student is absent, that is the number of days the student will have to make up any missing work. Because it is easy for students to get behind in their assignments, I encourage students to use every opportunity during and outside of class time to complete assignments. Please visit with me regarding any questions you may have, or assistance you may need, in order to complete any missing assignments. Missing tests will only be made up during school hours before or after school or during an agreed upon time.

## **Grading Standards**

Grades will be based on daily assignments and six week progress monitoring tests. Sixty percent of the overall grade will come from Daily Grades while forty percent of the overall grade will come from Test Grades. Daily grades include, but are not limited to, daily warm-ups, exit tickets, in class assignments, journaling, book club discussion/activities, etc. Test grades include quizzes, six week progress monitoring, group assignments, projects, etc.

### **Homework**

Homework is rarely assigned for this class, however, there may be some assignments that require work to be done outside of class time. Assignments given in this class will not be due until the start of the next class day unless otherwise instructed. Students will always be given adequate class time to complete their assignment the day it is given. However, should a student not complete an assignment during classtime, they will have the opportunity to finish the assignment outside of class before it is due the next day.

#### **Late Work / Make-Up Exams**

Late work: You must turn in all assignments complete and on time. <u>Complete</u> means you have done everything specified in the assignment instructions. <u>On time</u> means within 10 minutes of class start time on the due date. Incomplete assignments will not be graded. I do not accept them late without giving <u>prior approval</u> for work to be turned in late. Students with missing work will not be allowed to participate in extra activities such as Fun Friday (Dates to be determined), pep rallies, etc. Students with missing assignments will also join me in my room during lunch for Work Recovery to complete assignments while we have lunch. I am also available before school and after school, if advanced notice (day before) is given, for students to work.

Remember, one missed assignment or exam may lower your grade but will not cause you to fail. If you have multiple missing, incomplete, or late assignments, your grade will drop and possibly fall below passing. For best results, plan ahead, keep up with your assignments, attend class regularly and promptly communicate with me about any issues you need help with.
